To amend section 111 of title 18, United States Code, to prohibit barricading while evading arrest.
1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4 This Act may be cited as the "Secure Takedown and
5 Obstruction Prevention Act" or the "STOP Act".
6 SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL FINDINGS.
7 Congress finds the following:
8 (1) Law enforcement officers across the United

States face unprecedented challenges and dangers in

1	the execution of their duties to protect communities,
2	enforce laws, and maintain public order.
3	(2) Barricading actions often escalate con-
4	frontations, prolong dangerous standoffs, divert crit-
5	ical resources, and increase the risk of serious phys-
6	ical harm or death to officers, suspects, and innocent
7	bystanders.
8	(3) Federal law enforcement officers make pro-
9	found sacrifices every day, including risking their
10	lives to serve and protect the people of the United
11	States. Their unwavering dedication deserves the full
12	support and protection of Federal law.

14	"(2) Offense.—It shall be unlawful for any
15	person to—
16	"(A) engage in barricading in the course of
17	forcibly resisting a Federal law enforcement of-
18	ficer engaged in the performance of official du-
19	ties, in violation of subsection $(a)(1)$; or
20	"(B) aid, assist, or attempt to aid or assist
21	another person in committing conduct described
22	in subparagraph (A).
23	"(3) Penalty.—Any person who violates para-
24	graph (2)—

1	"(A) shall be fined under this title, impris-
2	oned for not more than 3 years, or both; or
3	"(B) shall be fined under this title, impris-
4	oned for not more than 5 years, or both, if,
5	during the commission of a violation of para-
6	graph (2)—
7	"(i) the violation creates a risk of or
8	causes serious physical harm to any per-
9	son;
10	"(ii) the person has possession or
11	claims possession of a deadly weapon; or
12	"(iii) a third party is present and is
13	unable to immediately and safely leave the
14	physical location of the violation.".
